

## About Ohyama-Kaido(road)

Mount Ohyama (in Isehara City, Kanagawa Prefecture) has long been considered as a holy place and object of mountain worship. The various and well-trodden routes leading there were called Ohyama Michi(road). Ohyama Kaido (road / highway) is one of the Ohyama roads, connecting Akasaka-Gomon(castle gate) in Edo(Tokyo) with Mount Ohyama. The mountain is also famous for its rain rituals .

Since the middle of the Edo Period, many people have made pilgrimages to Ohyama Shrine, and Ohyama Michi/Kaido has continued to be very popular among people. When making a pilgrimage to Ohyama Shrine, it was customary for worshippers to bring along a tachi(long sword) and dedicate it to the shrine. It is said that some of the swords were longer than the height of a human. Ohyama Kaido is known for being one of the historical pathways where a great number of people traveled and transported goods, which generated much prosperity and productive interaction among the people.



Ohyama-Kaido Furusato-Kan offers a variety of special programs throughout the year. The following are some examples.

### "Discovering the treasures of our town" "Exploring the history"

- ▶ Lectures focusing on the history and culture of Ohyama Kaido

### "Experiencing Ohyama Kaido"


- ▶ Guided walking tour of Ohyama Kaido while getting a detailed explanation of its rich history.

### Booking

Booking can be made through FUREAI-NET, which is the Kawasaki city internet system for booking public facilities. Registration is required for first time users of FUREAI-NET.

### Payment

Charges should be paid in cash in advance.

### Term for Booking

Booking using FUREAI-NET can be made four months to three days in advance.

### Cancellation

Cancellations must be made at least three days prior to reservation date.
